New Lights Welcome Visitors to Candler Park

As you walk or drive into the park this fall, take a moment to check out the new, artist-created entrance lanterns which have been successfully installed on both sides of the gates at the McClendon entrance to Candler Park. This Candler Park Conservancy project to update the main entrance was completed in mid-August just in time to shine at Fall Fest.

The park's entrance gates were originally designed and erected in 1932 by the firm of Edwards & Sayward (designers of the Candler Park golf clubhouse) with electric lights to accentuate the stone entrance. The original lights and fixtures had been vandalized sometime previous to 1980, with only the junction boxes and shards of the brackets remaining. The new design was inspired both by the work of the original architects (who did similar lights for Buttrick Hall at Agnes Scott College), as well as the fragments of the original lights remaining on the gates.

These bronze, solar powered lights are the product of the hard work of multiple people including Candler Park Conservancy Board Member Amy Erwin and the Beltline artist and fabricator, Cash Barnes. We also thank CPNO, Park Design, and the Urban Design Commission for their support on this project. Funding for the design, creation and installation of these lights was provided by the Candler Park Conservancy and Park Pride.

This installation is one of the first of multiple projects

coming from the Candler Park Conservancy to enhance Candler Park. Candler Park Conservancy is a 501c3 Non-Profit organization dedicated to providing long term solutions for Candler Park's natural environment and enhancements for the multiple uses of our park. As we approach the halfway mark of our 100 Days to 100% Full campaign, we are pleased to share that the campaign has been well received and parents are making donations of all sizes - from \$25 to \$2500! However, we have a ways to go to reach our goal of \$85,000 by November 8th. We need the help of every community member who is able to ensure our beloved elementary school's first large-scale fundraising campaign is a stratospheric success!

We know you understand how crucial an excellent public school is to a thriving community - not only does a great school attract more families to the neighborhood who then give back to the community, but it also increases property values and contributes to the growth and vibrancy of every aspect of our dynamic neighborhood.

What you may not know is that Mary Lin is one of the six schools in APS that does not receive Title-1 funding (significant funds allocated to schools where more than 40% of students qualify as disadvantaged). This means it's primarily up to the parents and local business community to provide additional funding for resources the APS budget does not cover, and unfortunately these budgets are not getting any bigger.

Our Principal, Ms. Briscoe, believes in using the budget she does have to invest in additional staff – keeping class sizes small and meeting the needs of all the students no matter their ability or learning challenges. This is a GOOD thing, but it means



there are less funds remaining for both immediate material needs in the classroom and long-term educational initiatives like professional development, new technology and curriculum enrichment resources (many already being utilized by high performing nearby schools such as Morningside and SPARK).






Lin community year-round and help us reach our goal to fill the fuel tank with \$85,000 by Nov. 8th.

Among our current activities:

The Conservancy has acquired the pro bono services of Perkins + Will architects to assist in developing a vision for the park consistent with the neighborhood master plan and the Conservancy's 2015 public input session. We expect Perkins + Will to complete a vision document by the end of the year.

Elsie Cormier of Smart Landscapes is providing her design services, also pro bono, for new plantings at the park entrance.

Any day now, the Conservancy's work to restore the park's entrance lights will be complete. The new lights were


Form into a football and place on a dish. Put in the refrigerator to chill. Before serving, roll the ball in




"Trees reduce bills not just by shading your house, but by cooling the air by releasing moisture," Asa Foss of the U.S. Green Building Council told AARP.

- Ceiling fans are your new best bud. Decrease the use of electricity-gobbling air conditioners with this simple little trick: "[Running fans] counterclockwise will push hot air up in the summer" -- your goal -- "and clockwise will trap heat inside to keep your rooms warmer during cooler months," advises U.S. News & World Report.
- Make sure your attic is properly ventilated. You almost might as well just send your utility company a blank check if you lack what Jason Joplin, program manager of the Center for Advancement of Roofing Excellence, calls "a continual flow of air to help protect the efficiency of your attic's insulation." The culprit working against achieving that: excess moisture buildup that clings to your roof's underside in winter from seemingly benign sources -i.e., appliances, showers and cooking vapors -- before ultimately soaking the insulation when the condensed moisture falls.

Joplin's suggestion to help ward off the problem? A properly balanced ventilation system consisting of Cobra Ridge Vent (installed at the ridge) and Cobra IntakePro (installed at the eave) by GAF (gaf.com), North America's leading roofing manufacturer. "Both work in tandem to allow cool, fresh air to enter at the eave edge while forcing moist, super-heated air out of the ridge vent," he explains.

• Beware sneaky thermostats. Sure, your big-screen TVs all over the house are the envy of the neighborhood, but you're making an expensive mistake if they -- or even lamps -- are positioned near air-conditioning thermostats. "The thermostat senses heat from these appliances, which can cause the air conditioner to run longer than necessary," advises the website Home Energy Saver.
