Halloween In Little Five Points: Doubly Spooky!

It's baaack ... Atlanta's popular and always irreverent in-town business district has doubled its annual spook-tacular Halloween Festival & Parade, now scheduled for two days: 12 pm — 6 pm, Saturday and Sunday, October 26-27, 2002.

The highly anticipated return of the hilarious and horrific L5P Halloween Parade starts at 5 pm on Saturday and winds its way through the streets of Little Five Points. The L5P Halloween Festival & Parade, a two-day, outdoor event is free and open to the public.

Back again this year is organic pumpkin carving, street entertainers, live music, a costume contest for adults, children and their pets, and special in-store promotions from L5P restaurants, bars and retailers.

The expanded event features new additions to the festival including a local artist's market and hands-on children's activities. Organizers are encouraging intown neighborhoods to enter this year's parade to compete in the "Battle of the Best Neighborhood Halloween Float."

The signature event, the Saturday parade, is sure to both scare and delight. The

L5P Halloween Parade route starts at Austin and Euclid Avenues and ends near Goldsboro Park at Euclid and North Avenues. This year's parade features the world-famous Seed & Feed Marching Abominable, the five "Hallo-Queens" of L5P, Art Cars, awardwinning high school marching bands, motorcycle units, roller bladers, skateboarders, and self-built Halloween floats by participating schools, neighborhood groups and L5P retailers. Parade viewers are encouraged to claim their viewing spots early along the parade route to cheer on the participants, snap pictures and celebrate the spirit of Halloween in L5P. The deadline for parade applications is October 15, 2002.

Good News On Traffic Calming For Candler Park

There is good news on two fronts regarding the neighborhood's traffic calming effort. Here's an update:

McLendon Avenue

First, by the time you have read this article, the city should have signed off on the neighborhood's proposal for traffic calming on McLendon. As those who have been following this issue know, the primary focus of the neighborhood's efforts is the intersection of Candler Park Drive and McLendon Avenue.

As of the deadline for submitting articles for this month's Messenger, there are two possible proposals for this intersection. Both proposals would add a 4' median that would serve as a pedestrian refuge at the intersection, in conjunction with boldly striped crosswalks. One option is to supplement the median and enhanced crosswalks with 3-way stops at both Candler Park Drive intersections (the road is not contiguous). The second option is to put in a stop light with "walk/don't walk" signals. Next month I will provide further information regarding the chosen option.

In addition to the Candler Park intersection, the McLendon proposal calls for the installation of 10' bulbouts at intersections on the south side of McLendon between Moreland and Page. A bulbout is when the curb is extended into the street. The proposed McLendon bulbouts will narrow McLendon from 32' to 22' and improve the sidewalks and curb cuts at the intersections. In the McLendon/Clifton business district, the proposal calls for extending the north curb 3' into the road and having 7' bulbouts on the south side of the road. This will narrow the road and provide a pedestrian buffer on both sides of the road.

Euclid Avenue, Oakdale Road, Candler Park Drive and Clifton Road

The second piece of good news is that the city has offered an interim solution to traffic calming on Euclid, Oakdale, Candler Park Drive and Clifton Road. While there is no money to implement structural changes to these roads, the city is willing to narrow the roads with a combination of striping and ceramic "bubbles."

The bubbles are approximately 6" in diameter and 4" high, and contain reflectors. Instead of using bulbouts and medians to calm traffic, rows of ceramic bubbles would simulate the bulbouts and medians. The city has successfully used the bubbles to calm traffic at the intersection of Rock Springs and Pelham Roads in Morningside and at the intersection of Wylie and Powell Streets in Cabbage Town.

Members of the traffic calming committee will be contacting residents of Euclid, Oakdale, Candler Park Drive and Clifton Road to educate them about the ceramic bubbles and seek their approval for using the bubbles. I am hopeful that the property owners will embrace the bubbles as an effective means of slowing traffic and making our streets safer for children and pedestrians.





Help Save Our Sewers!

The City of Atlanta has developed a Clean Water Initiative to improve its crumbling wastewater system. The program is going to cost \$3 BILLION(!) and without significant help from the Federal Government, the ratepayers of Georgia, and Atlanta in particular, will shoulder this burden alone.

If forced to shoulder the tax burden with no assistance, the consequences for Atlanta's residents are dire. Ratepayers could pay 5% of their annual income for sewer bills, and commercial sewer rates will be 55% higher than any other city in the region. Property tax bills are likely to increase even further than they already have.

Atlanta's water issues ultimately impact the more than 7 million Georgians across the region and downstream of Atlanta. The safety of the Chattahoochee River is essential for these Georgians to have safe drinking water, and our health and the health of those downstream from Atlanta is threatened daily by breaches from Atlanta's crumbling sewer system.

It is essential that the Federal government assist Atlanta's residents by funding 30% — or \$1 billion — of this project. Other cities have received significant Federal money to improve and upgrade their sewer systems. In fact, San Diego recently received \$70 million in Federal support for one of their projects through a STAG grant from the VA-HUD appropriations subcommittee.

Mayor Shirley Franklin, City Council President Cathy Woolard, and other city officials urge you to contact your U.S. representative and senators today.




