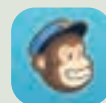

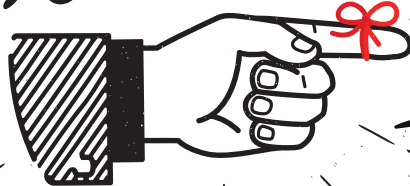

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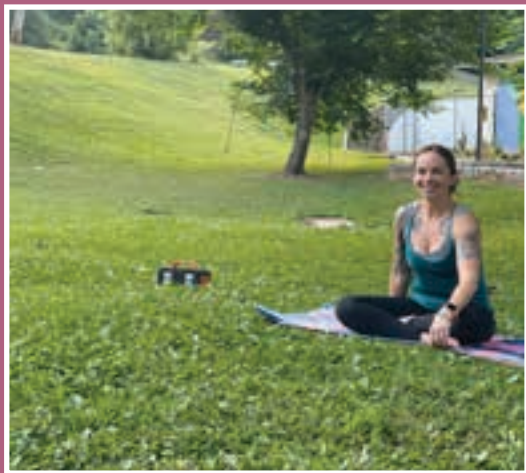

Imaging Candler Park 100 Years Ago

Candler Park to Be Most Beautiful in All America According to Plans of City Engineer Kauffman

After accepting from Asa G. Candler a splendid tract of land in the beautiful Druid Hills section to be devoted to park purposes, the city government has caused the municipal engineer to draw the detailed plans for one of the most magnificent public amusement and recreation grounds that can perhaps be found in any city of the world.

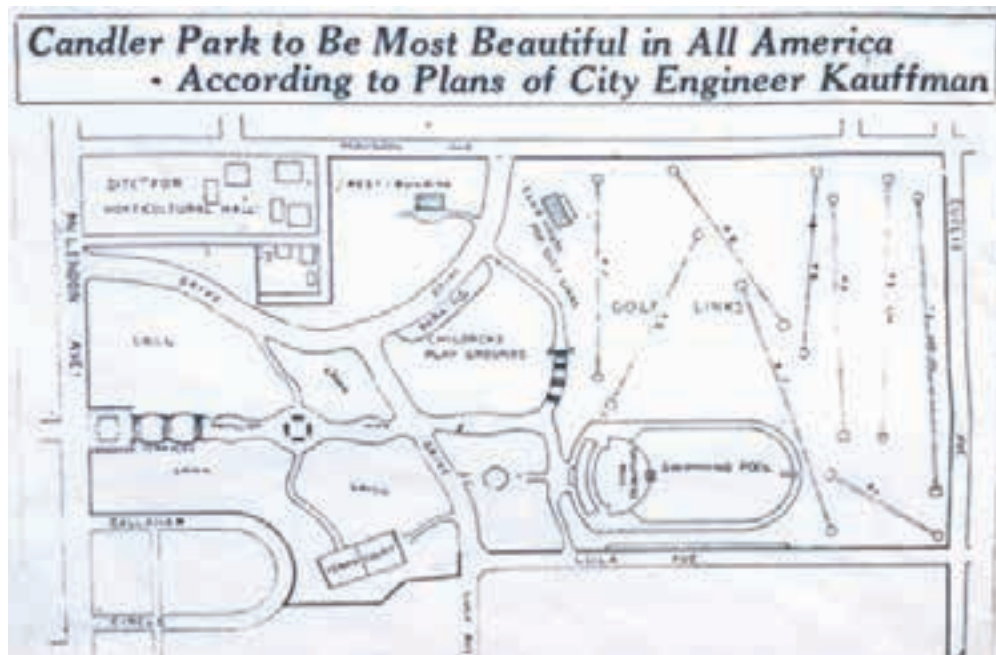
These plans, which are presented in the drawing above, are now ready for the consideration of the city finance committee and the commissions of roads and revenues of DeKalb county, who are to provide funds for the full prosecution of the fine park program.

Not only do the plans drawn by City Engineer C. E. Kauffman contemplate one of the most beautiful park ideas ever presented to the officials of any American city, but the details worked out by the engineer are so complete in ensemble and so perfect in every particular that they have caused much admiration and favorable comment from every one who has seen them.

Golf. Tennis. Polo Grounds.

In preparing the plan for this park, City Engineer Kauffman provided space and areas for golf courses, tennis grounds, polo grounds, baseball park, swimming pool and an immense stadium, seating many thousands of people.

In planning Candler Park Mr. Kauffman also took



into consideration accessibility, topographical and climate conditions as well as the possible layout of the driveways and lakes. These considerations were for the purpose of enhancing the beauty of the fine tract.

Looks Into Future

From the studies made by the city engineer he makes the following conclusions: That the proposed park should be totally at variance with all other city parks; That it should be a pleasure ground in every way in keeping with what Atlanta will some day be in the way of the south's greatest city; ...

Entrance on McLendon

An immense sunken garden will be one of the noble features of the park overlooked from the pavillion. There will be a fine amphitheater with terraces, gentle upward grades on both sides of the avenue

with a mid-pavilion in the center of the rotunde. Flower beds, gorgeous budding shrubs, etc. will enhance the beauty of this portion of the park.

Children Playgrounds

Children's playgrounds will be one of the finest features of Candler park and these have been wellnigh perfectly provided for by City Engineer Kauffman. The swimming pools will also be large and classically beautiful.

The golf courses will also be a splendid feature of Candler park and these have been laid out with the utmost care. These will be on the north end of the park where there will also be a clubhouse.

All the buildings will be classic in their simplicity, and each of them will be designed with an eye for beauty as well as utility.

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Why Pay Attention To Your

Lymphatic System?

This article is about the Lymphatic System. It is best read when jumping on a small rebounder trampoline. If that is unavailable (go get one!), the other reading-friendly option is to cycle through a few yoga positions starting with sun salutations and then moving on to downward facing dog and cat-cow. This movement will make more sense shortly, assuming you can read this while bouncing up and down for 5-10 minutes.

Why is this best read while moving?

The lymphatic system is a critical part of the immune system protecting you from invaders and fighting infections. The body has over four hundred nodes connected through lymph vessels that are like your blood vessels only there is no muscle to pump the fluid. Movement stimulates the lymph flow encouraging your lymphatic activity and preventing blockages. One of the best ways to get this movement is to bounce on a rebounder trampoline. Others can be a brisk walk, high-intensity interval training including squats and lunges, or yoga. For best results, do this every day.

There are other ways to stimulate and improve your lymphatic system health, but first, let's explore why it is so important.

What does your lymphatic system do?

The lymph vessels pump lymph fluid that contains white blood cells called lymphocytes. These cells attack invaders and produce antibodies that fight infections. The system helps regulate immune activity allowing your immune cells to monitor your cells and tissues throughout the body. The lymph system also filters toxins from your tissues. This is done in lymph nodes spread throughout the body, especially the neck, armpits, and around the digestive tract. The spleen and thymus are critical for helping filter out harmful substances like bacteria, viruses, cancerous cells, and other foreign matter.

Great! Now why am I still bouncing around?

The lymph system does not have its own pump and flows upward toward the neck. Without movement it is challenging to move fluid along, then you can suffer from swollen glands and your risk of infection is much greater. Luckily, even deep breathing from the bottom of your lungs can help this process, but jumping on a mini trampoline is way more fun!



Can I stop bouncing now?

Yeah, probably. Don't worry, there are other ways to stimulate the lymphatic system.

- Dry brushing – use a soft natural bristle brush and sweep towards your heart for 5-10 minutes before your bath or shower.
- Massage – using a light pressure technique to move the lymph called lymphatic drainage massage.
- Deep breathing from the bottom of the diaphragm while letting your belly expand works.
- Hydration! Staying hydrated is critical as even mild dehydration can inhibit lymphatic flow.
- Infrared sauna treatments – increased sweat production and improved blood flow help detox the body and can be quite relaxing.

POOL SURVEY RESULTS

It's summer here in Atlanta, and everyone knows that will bring its fair share of heat. One of the best ways to cool off this summer is to go to the pool. And the Candler Park pool is right nearby, but this brings up some questions. How many people actually go to the Candler Park Pool? If they don't, why not? The best way to answer those questions is to conduct a survey.

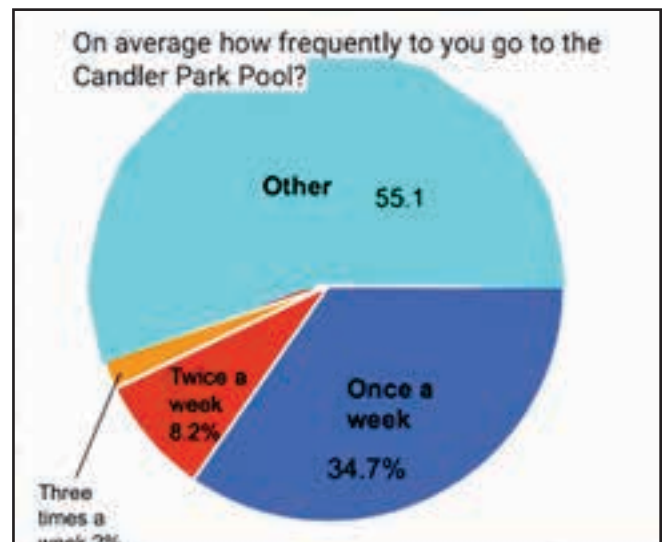
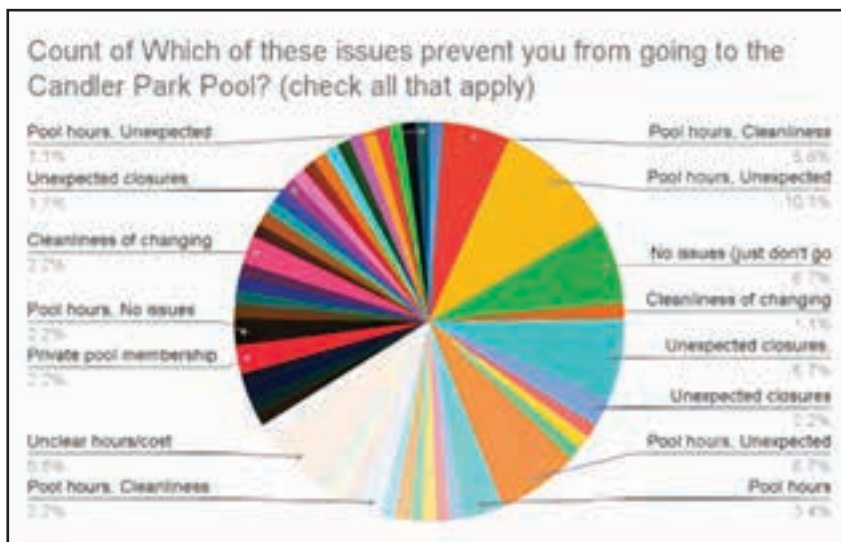
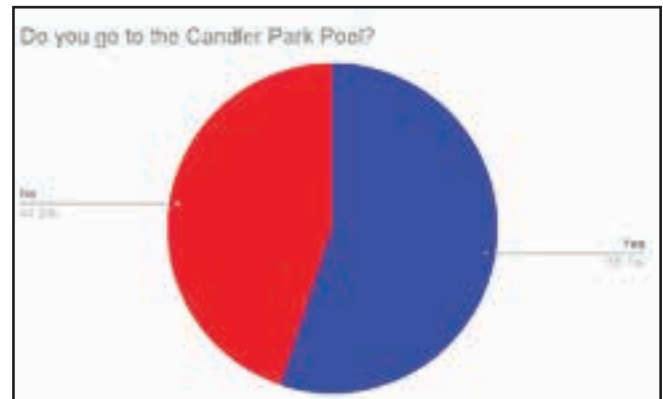
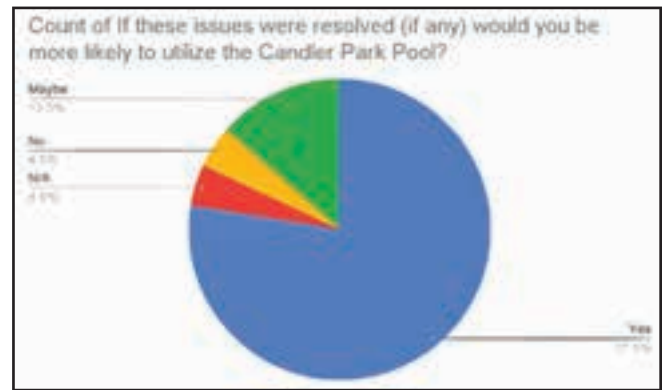
The first question of the survey was fairly straightforward: Do you go to the Candler Park Pool? 55.1% of the people surveyed answered Yes, and 44.9% answered No.

The next question was directed to the surveyors who answered Yes: On average how frequently do you go to the Candler Park Pool? This was answered by a wide variety of answers, best shown in the included chart.

The third question was given to everybody: Which of these issues prevent you from going to the Candler Park Pool? (check all that apply) The answers to this question mostly reflected the same sort of thing, reflected in the chart included.

The fourth and final question is the most important in my opinion: If these issues were resolved (if any) would you be more likely to utilize the Candler Park Pool? On this question most answered yes but a few answered maybe and even less answered no.

In conclusion over half of the people surveyed go to the Candler Park Pool, and almost everybody had an issue to report. Most people also said they would or maybe utilize the pool more frequently or at all if these issues were fixed.

- CPNO News and Updates. CPNO monthly meeting agendas, Zoning Committee agendas, and information about other CPNO committees and events.

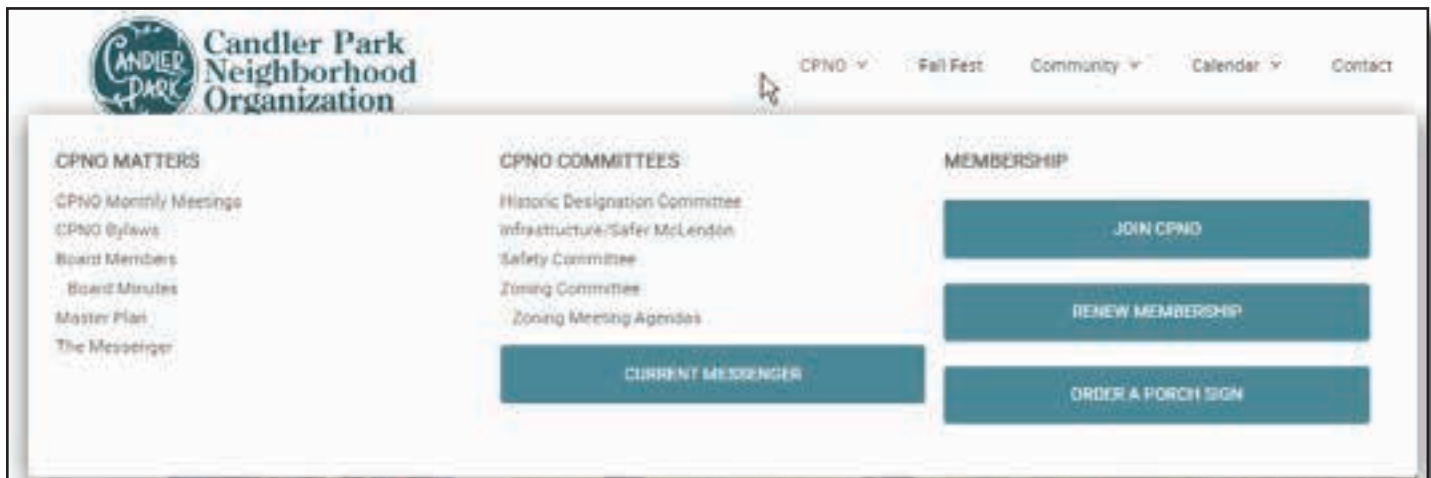

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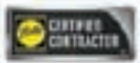
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
